Based on the NAMRIA Monthly Web Analytics Report, most of the visitors of the NAMRIA online platforms are the general public and the national government sector. It was also observed that there is an upward trend in hits/access from Filipinos based overseas. The NAMRIA Lot Plotter remained the most accessed feature of the GP. The Land Cover Maps, Slope Maps, Inundation Maps, Ground Control Points, and the Topographic Maps are the most requested and frequently downloaded data from the NAMRIA website and the GP website. These data are essential for infrastructure development and socioeconomic activities.
